**Transportation:**  
We have chartered a bus to bring people to and from the above-listed hotels and wedding/reception. The bus will pick people up first from the DoubleTree, at 3 pm, and then from the Radisson, around 3:30 pm. The bus will be making continuous trips back to the hotels beginning at 8:30 pm.

If you prefer to drive yourself, please park within the designated area in order to avoid unnecessary damage to the grass. Directions are listed below. Also, see map on reverse side for site locations.

You will most likely choose to fly into Tallahassee Regional Airport. The airlines are limited, though (only Delta, Northwest, and USAir), so you may decide it is easier to fly into Jacksonville or Ft. Walton, and drive. It would be 2.5 to 3 hours from either one.

You may wish to rent a car while you're in Tallahassee, as there is no public transportation to speak of, and it is very much a driving city. However, there are also taxis available.

**Directions:**  
**From the airport to hotels**  
Leaving the airport turn right, traveling east on Capital Circle SW, toward S Lake Bradford Road, for 1.65 miles. Turn left onto Springfield Road, Springfield becomes Lake Bradford Road, travel 2.5 miles.

**To each hotel, after following above directions: to the DoubleTree**  
Turn slightly right onto W Gaines Street for 0.73 miles. Turn left onto Railroad Avenue, continue 0.45 miles, Railroad becomes S Macomb Street. Turn right onto W Park Avenue for 0.39 miles to Adams Street.  
**to the Radisson**  
Turn right onto W Orange Avenue. Continue to follow Orange Avenue E for 1.35 miles. Turn left onto S Monroe Street, traveling 2.31 miles.

**Airport to St. George Island**  
Travel Southeast on Capital Circle SW toward S Lake Bradford Road, for 3.84 miles. Turn right onto Crawfordville Road (FL 61/US 319). Continue to follow US 319 S for 65.38 miles. Turn left onto Island Drive (CR 61A). Continue to follow CR 61A south for 5.51 miles. Turn left onto CR 300 (FL 61A). Continue to follow CR 300.

**To the wedding and reception from hotels**  
From the Radisson to the Land Co-op, first turn left onto Monroe Street, then left again at your first light, onto Tennessee Street.

From the DoubleTree to the Land Co-op, turn right onto Park Avenue, then left at first light, which is Monroe Street. Travel 2 blocks to Tennessee Street and turn right.

**From both hotels, after following above directions:**  
After 3 blocks, 0.2 miles, turn left on to Meridian Street. After 0.1 mile, veer right onto Miccosukee Road. Continue on Miccosukee for 11.2 miles total. You will pass some schools on your right, a hospital on your left, and (if they aren't done by then!) a construction zone. At 3.2 miles you will come to a light at Capital Circle NE. At 10.2 miles you'll come to a 4-way stop at Crump Road. After this you will travel another mile, then you'll see a sign that says MLC; turn right, and follow the signs to parking.

**To the wedding and reception from St. George Island**  
Leave St. George Island, going across the bridge to the mainland. The road will take you to US Highway 98. Turn right on US 98, heading east. It is about 20 miles to the bridge that crosses the Carrabelle River. (Note: Good seafood restaurant, Julia Mae's, just before the Carrabelle bridge, on the right.)

From the center of the bridge at Carrabelle it is 11 miles to the point where US 98 takes a bit of a turn and separates from US 319 which goes to Sopchoppy. Stay on US 98. Continue going east for 11.5 miles to a bridge which crosses the Ochlockonee River. (Note: Good seafood restaurant, Angelo's, on the right at end of the bridge on the east side of the river.)

Continue on US 98 for another 9.3 miles, which will get you to the place where the Crawfordville Highway turns off to the left. Turn left and go north on the Crawfordville Highway. After 19.7 miles, turn right, head east on Capital Circle SW and go for 9.8 miles to the intersection of Capital Circle and Miccosukee Road. Turn right on Miccosukee Road and go east 8 miles to 4-way stop at Crump Road. After this you will travel another mile, then you'll see a sign that says MLC; turn right, and follow the signs to parking.

**Tourist Destinations:**  
**Tallahassee Museum of Natural History**  
The Tallahassee Museum of Natural History and Science used to be known as the Tallahassee Junior Museum, and is traditionally a place to take children. However, I also think it's just a great place to get a sense of what Northern Florida is all about. There is a nature trail, with animals in very large natural-habitat pens, and also a swamp with cypress trees. As a child, I used to imagine the Seminole Indians still living within the folds of this sanctuary. If you have time and the inclination, check it out.

The Museum is located on Rankin Road. It is very close to the Tallahassee Airport, only a few miles from West Pensacola Street. From downtown Tallahassee, take Pensacola Street to Lake Bradford Road. Head south to Orange Avenue, turn right, and go to Rankin Avenue. Alternatively, follow Capital Circle SW to Lake Bradford Road (Springhill Road); a sign will direct you to the Museum.

**Edward Ball Wakulla Springs State Park**  
This is one of the most beautiful places on Earth, and, if you have time while visiting Tallahassee, it is definitely worth a visit. It is one of the world's largest fresh-water springs, covering about 3 acres, as well as a gorgeous and historic lodge and restaurant. Although the water is cold, on a hot day there are few things more refreshing than a swim in the designated swim area (i.e. alligator-free), and there are two different boat tours. On the 2-mile River Tour, you will see an amazing plethora of wildlife, including birds and alligators, while the Glass Bottom Boat tour is more about the spring. Located 15 miles south of Tallahassee on FL 267 at FL 61.

**From hotels to Wakulla Springs**  
Travel south on Monroe Street for 2 blocks, then turn right on Gaines Street. Go west one block and turn left on Adams Street. Continue going south (the name of the road will now be Crawfordville Highway) for approximately 1.5 miles, and there will be a sign that says Wakulla Springs with an arrow pointing to the left. Veer left and travel south on Wakulla Springs Road. Go for 7.6 miles on this road and there will be a blinking light. Turn left and go for 0.1 miles. The entrance to Wakulla Springs is on the right.
